



CONCEPT: TREE TRUNK -LAYERS OF TIME

Belonging in Nature is a sustainable glamping retreat inspired by tree trunk layers of time, where the growth rings symbolize memory, environmental change, and the evolving relationship between people and nature. The circular site plan reflects these layers through the placement of treehouses, glamping pods, and wellness spaces, each designed to support seasonal awareness and ecological harmony. Rooted in biophilic principles, the retreat encourages guests to slow down, engage their senses, and rediscover a sense of connection through immersive, low-impact architecture. Every element, from material choices to spatial flow, is crafted to evoke continuity, reflection, and a deep sense of place.


Background: Rula is a caring mother of two children, aged 3 and 4. With a background in pediatric nursing, she is well-equipped to navigate their healthcare needs.







BLOCKING PLAN










RENDERED FLOOR PLAN






























SUSTAINABILITY & CODE PLATES


1. PASSIVE SOLAR & NATURAL LIGHT

Curtain walls and glass were used extensively in the pediatric clinic design to maximize natural light and solar heat while adhering to biophilic principles. This architectural option allows sunshine to permeate the space, minimizing the need for artificial lighting and capturing solar warmth to save heating costs. Such integration fosters a connection to environment, improves patient and worker well-being, and emphasizes sustainability. The clinic exemplifies sustainable, energy-efficient design by regulating temperature with passive solar systems powered by the sun.



3. Biophilic design - Trees and Plants

The creative integration of trees and plants into the pediatric clinic's architecture is critical to producing a biophilic setting, which has been carefully chosen to ensure child safety and contribute to air purification. Greenery enhances both the exterior and internal areas, resulting in a seamless flow between the two. A tree strategically located in the foyer, signifying life and expansion, serves as a natural focus point for guests. Furthermore, built-in seating places are intelligently created with trees and plants behind them, providing patients and their families with a relaxing embrace of nature as they wait. Green walls reinforce this link by incorporating vertical gardens into the clinic's areas. This living infrastructure not only filters the air by removing pollutants, but it also greatly benefits the clinic's young patients and their families by producing a tranquil, nurturing environment that promotes healing and comfort.







2. SMART FLOORS (PURE GENIUS)














- Neighborhood: Old City, Philadelphia

APARTMENT 2 FLOOR PLANS




